#### State of the POGS Address

It surely is a great way to start an activity with something uplifting and inspiring, and for the past POGS activities, we were able to see the updated POGS prayer, national anthem, and hymn, all with theme of POGS rising as one. I would like to acknowledge Dr. Ryan Capitulo for conceptualizing the POGS prayer and Dr. Socs Bernardino, our PRO, for the National anthem and the POGS Hymn. Thank you as well to our POGS pool of talented singers. (Drs. Rainerio S. Abad, Benjamin D. Cuenca, Anna Belen Ignacio-Alensuela, Eileen M. Manalo, Romerico F. Torres, Anne Catherine A. Castro, Melchor C. Dela Cruz, Jr., Renee Vina G. Sicam, Eleyneth L. Ilagan-Valencia, and Zedrix I. Gallito)

In my inaugural address, my plan to create projects to ensure and boost good mental health of our members as we went through two years of restricted health protocols and stresses became a reality with the creation of the Adhoc Committee on Members' Mental wellness and Motivation (M3). The first webinar entitled Mope, Cope and Hope was very much appreciated with 1119 POGS members as zoom attendees and as much as 3.9K Facebook

Likewise, we have asked the support of the different POGS committees and the subspecialty heads to limit the number of webinars per day to avoid overlapping, and to limit activities during weekends. To date, we have noticed improvement, and I would like to thank all those concerned for their cooperation. Thank you to Dr. Efren Domingo as he chairs the Committee on Internal Affairs.

Because of the increased use of online platforms, the POGS Learning Management System (LMS) is currently being utilized for online examinations, review courses, skills, and more. The two adhoc committees M3 and LMS are being chaired by Dr. Ryan Capitulo and he will be further discussing his plans later on.

### Moratorium Review

Last year was the moratorium year and we have members who will be taking this year's oral and written examination. We have conducted another oral review last February with 41 enrollees. Of the regular takers, 24/35 (69%) passed while all the 6 moratorium takers (100%) passed the exam. The result of the 3 day Part II diplomate oral examination showed a passing grade of 84%.

The moratorium review for the written examination will be conducted on April and May and this is under the Committee on Medical Education (CME) headed by Dr. Milagros Tia-Jocson with invited faculty coming from the academe and accredited training institutions. The CME committee continues with their regional webinars to give updates in the diagnosis and management of cases seen in our practice.

I would like to thank the PBOG for successfully conducting the first batch of the Part II diplomate oral exam chaired by Dr. Rey De los Reyes.

### National Buntis Day

The National Buntis day was celebrated on March 10, 2022 with R9 as host. The theme was "Pagmamahal at Pag-aalaga kay Pregnant Mommy para sa masaya at malusog na baby" and it had a 3-day lay fora lectures on health, nutrition and economic aspects conducted on social media nationwide. Congratulations to Dr. Annette Macayaon, the over-all chair, with the support



of R9 RD, Dr. Jennifer Araneta, the Chapter President Dr. Neilyn Diono, and all the hardworking members and all the participating regions for making this event a success.

### Continuing projects:

Another project I have continued and supported is that of the AdHoc Committee on POGS Organization of Government Institutions (POGI) with Past President Dr Mario A. Bernardino as its Director and chaired this year by Past President Dr Benjamin D. Cuenca. This committee expanded the dissemination of National HEALTH programs and advocacies related to Women's Healthcare. They cascaded these through webinar series last year educating our members on the Service Delivery Network and the Universal health care law. This year, they will be coming up with a PRIMER on this and there will be continued collaboration with the different POGS committees and other allied professionals as well as with regional champions, to strengthen the establishment of an efficient and effective referral system amongst the different stakeholders.

### Collaboration projects on External Affairs

The MOA to adopt a community for women's healthcare and capacity building in Agusan del Sur has been signed by the provincial governor and this is the project of the Adhoc Committee on Manila Declaration. This committee aims to make HPV testing more available and affordable by collaborating with DOH to operationalize the WHO Cervical CA prevention.

Dr. Macayaon is the POGS trainor for the Maternal and Perinatal Death Surveillance Response (MPDSR) process which aims to reduce the maternal and perinatal deaths. Aside from her plans to conduct the Training of Trainors to strengthen capacity on MPDSR, she has been invited as one of the regional facilitators in the capacity building workshop for the Eastern Mediterranean Regional office (EMRO). Congratulations Dr. Macayaon!

#### RA10747 (Rare Diseases Act of 2016)

DOH approved the development of a national strategic plan on integrated rare disease management program for the period of 2022-2026 which aims to provide comprehensive medical care to patients with rare diseases. All specialty societies were requested to submit a list of rare diseases in their specialty based on prevalence, impact, diagnostics and treatment, and our society submitted 46 rare diseases, of which 23 (or 50%) were approved. The NIH will then finalize which of the rare diseases submitted by all specialty societies will merit funding for research.

#### ROADMAP 2022

There has been a noticeable increase in the usage of POGS Nationwide Statistics System (PNSS) by our members. The Committee Chair, Dr. Macayaon, will conduct another workshop later this year to improve the terminologies and to input additional data that is important to do quality research.

Committee on Hospital Accreditation (CHAS) chaired by Dr. Pressie Eclarin is working hard in inviting lying-in hospitals to be accredited for service and by elaborating to them its advantages. The committee is also collaborating with the PNSS to ensure accurate and timely submissions so that only institutions with complete requirements will be visited for re-accreditation.

We saw the decline of cases during the time of pandemic which has greatly affected the performance of our trainees. The plan of enhancing collaboration and networking amongst institutions to boost the number of cases required by the trainees, which will benefit both trainees and patients, was also part of my project. The Council for Residents' Education, Enhancement and Development (CREED), headed by Dr. Cynthia Fernandez-Tan, has already approved that the rotation of residents through a MOA in CHAS accredited for training or service institutions be allowed as long as there is a Fellow of POGS to monitor, supervise and evaluate the rotating trainee. Thank you to the InCREEDibles!

The Committee on Ethics and Medical Practice chaired by Dr. Lourdes B. Capito (FIGO Chair, Committee for ethical aspect of human reproduction and women's health) will now bring the bioethics forum to the regions with the regional representative discussing their own case guided by the Ethics committee members followed by a panel discussion with critiquing. They will also come up with a book of ethics consisting of compiled local cases

The Committee on Community Service, chaired by Dr. Sherri Ann S. Suplido, has shifted the usual lecture to case-based discussions, with the midwives as part of the discussants. This has encouraged active participation from the entire community including the doctors, midwives, nurses and students, and has paved the way for a more rewarding and fruitful learning experience.

The Committee on Patient Safety chaired by Dr. Ma. Virginia Abalos has translated the principles of Team Strategies and Tools to Enhance Performance and Patient safety (TEAMSTEPPS) and the promotion of the culture of safety from principles to action. Aside from lectures on best safety practices and maternal sepsis,

there is also a case discussion where regional members actively participate in.

The Ad Hoc Committee on Patient Blood Management under its chair Dr. Maria Carmen Hernandez-Quevedo will be coming up with a Primer for the obstetrician gynecologist and the research that they will undertake has been approved by PURA (POGS Unified Research Agenda)

The Committee on Environment and Women's Health is being chaired by Dr. Anabelle Alensuela, and has 2 subcommittees namely, Reproductive Developmental and Environmental Health (RDEH) chaired by Dr. Ditas Decena and Climate Change and Disaster Risk Preparedness (CCDRP) chaired by Dr. Erlidia Llamas-Clark.

Dr. Ditas Decena, FIGO Chair of Committee on Climate Change and Toxic Environmental Exposures, is one of the speakers of FIGO global webinar entitled "Full Circle Effects of the Environment on Women's Health". For her subcommittee on RDEH, Dr. Decena has asked the regions to adopt and adapt the best practices to promote environmental health and to be aware of its impact in the society

Dr. Llamas-Clark for her Subcommittee on CCDRP will continue to empower women and the communities in the era of climate change, disasters and covid 19 pandemic with their webinars.

The other committees of Reproductive Health 2 are the following: Adolescent Health Initiative Perspectives (AHIP), Family Planning, Gender Based Violence (GBV) and Preparatory Reproductive Health Education Priming Young Adults for Responsible Engagement (PREPARE). Dr. Rosendo R. Roque is the project director of the AHIP and the Task force Chair, Dr. Ma. Socorro Bernardino will present later and launch the MUTYA APP, the first Filipino free downloadable app sponsored by our society designed for the young teen Pinay to educate and help them understand better their developmental changes and menstrual health the digital way.

The Subcommittee on Gender Based Violence Project director and task force chair Dr. Lyra Ruth Clemente-Chua will be conducting violence against women and children (VAWC) desk seminar workshops following the module created by R7 Cebu Chapter.

The Subcommittee on Family Planning chaired by Dr. Esmerlado Ilem will be having several family planning regional lectures and will be working for POGS to be recognized by DOH as a training institution for family planning services.

The Task Force on Preparatory Reproductive Health Education Priming Young Adults for Responsible Engagement (PREPARE ) chaired by Dr. Diosdado Mariano has started the training of trainors in the regions (PREPARE warriors) and POGS will forge a tripartite agreement with DEPEd and Popcom for a wider cascade of comprehensive sexual education.

The Committee on Reproductive Health of Dr. Alensuela aims to help in achieving the three zeros of the United Nation Population Fund Agency (UNFA) by 2030 which aims to have zero preventable maternal deaths, zero unmet need for family planning and zero gender based violence and harmful practices.

POGS as the premier organization on reproductive health will continue with its collaborative fight against teenage pregnancy (Laban kay Nene) by involving the stake holders (lawmakers, DOH, International committees UNFPA, POPCOM, DEPed, Doctors, Midwives, nurses, and students.

The Committee on Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) headed by Dr. Gil S. Gonzalez is coming out with 4 new CPGs and an updated practice bulletin.

### ICT Members portal:

The Committee on Scientific Works under Dr Enrico Oblepias is on track with their schedules for the submission of the Midyear Interesting cases and Research works in time for the Oral presentations in July. They are also working hand in hand with the AdHoc Committee of the POGS Unified Research Agenda (PURA) for the establishment of a Scientific works Registry (PURA tracker).

The Committee on Reproductive Health 1 headed by Dr Ronaldo Santos will have series of webinars and conferences as well in the next days to come. The Task Force on Immunization for Women (IFW) recently held a webinar entitled, Maternal Immunization as an Essential Component of Life.

The Committee on Library and Archives headed by Dr. Gay Gonzalez has always been busy maintaining the virtual library set up with the help of the POGS librarian including but not limited to gathering, indexing, compiling and archiving information and materials relevant to our practice. It also continuously serves the reading and research needs of the members and even non-members of the POGS.

At this point, let me thank our finance officer, Dr. Erwin de Mesa for overseeing that sufficient funds are available to cover the operational needs of our society.

### Regional Empowerment

Regio 8 headed by Dr. Mina Sirikit Tagra- participated in the National Buntis day and has responded and delivered relief goods for typhoon Odette victims.

Region 9 headed by Dr. Jennifer Araneta is one with the nation in celebrating the National Covid 19 vaccination day and has vaccinated a total of 1191 residents including pregnant women and children aged 12-17 years old from Nov 2021 up to Jan. 2022. This is in collaboration with the Zamboanga City health office.

Region 10 headed by Dr. Imelda Carbajal has reached out to our members who were affected by Typhoon Odette. They initiated the Sagip Surigao project and has conducted surgical missions and cervical cancer screening

National Capital Region (NCR) headed by Dr. Rosalie Junio has conducted the Buntiktok challenge as part of the celebration of the National Buntis day. NCR clusters have their own Maternal and Mortality webinars, Grand rounds, and regular lectures to residents to be rotated among member hospitals

I would like to commend and thank all the regional directors, chapter presidents and officers for continuously supporting all programs and activities of the different POGS committees. Kudos to you all!


### Pride of POGS

nce more, this year 2022, the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society conducted its 1st quarter virtual general membership assembly through a Town Hall meeting held last April 11.

It highlighted the reports on what has been done during the first 100 days term of the current leadership. Further, the theme "POGS rises as ONE" was chosen to signify the society's resilience despite the circumstances that we were caught into for more than 2 years now during this pandemic.

The opening prayer was led by the immediate past president of the Society, Dr Benjamin D. Cuenca. Following through the ceremonial protocols, President Dr. Marlyn T. Dee officially opened the meeting and an established quorum was declared by yours truly with 1,800 member attendees present online during the event. There were 2,581 registered members for the meeting noted on record.

The Agenda was approved and seconded by two past presidents, Drs. Ditas Cristina D. Decena and Elisa O. Tiu, respectively.

President Dee started by acknowledging the persons behind the creation of the updated versions of the POGS Prayer, National Anthem and Hymn. Acknowledged were Dr. Ryan Capitulo, being the author of this year's POGS Prayer, and the current PRO, Dr Ma. Socorro C. Bernardino for initiating the innovations on the new version of the POGS Hymn were recognized.



The following pool of talented singers from the POGS' members and leaders who sang the newest version of our Hymn were also appreciated, in the persons of Past Presidents Drs. Rainerio S. Abad and Benjamin D. Cuenca, Drs. Anna Belen Ignacio- Alensuela, Eileen M. Manalo, Romerico F. Torres, Anne Catherine A. Castro, Melchor C. Dela Cruz, Renee Vina G. Sicam, Eleyneth L. Ilagan-Valencia and Zedrix I. Gallito.

Dr. Dee made clear in her State of the POGS address and comprehensive report, the notable achievements of each of the different Standing committees with the assigned Chairpersons and Trustees, why those particular projects and activities were done and what the next steps and plans of each working groups are going to be.

First in line mentioned were the committees created this year for the priority Presidential projects; the AdHoc Committee on The Sub-committee on the new accreditation program being

Members' Mental Wellness and Motivation or (M3) to ensure and boost good mental health of the members and the AdHoc Committee on POGS Learning Management System (LMS) for use of every committee for online examinations, review courses and skills management of each concerned members.

The active participation of the different regions from NCR, Region 1 (Northwestern Luzon) to Region 11 (Southern Mindanao) led by their respective Regional Directors; Drs. Rosalie E. Junio - NCR, Ruth Judith Gay V. Cristobal - R1, Emma Aguada Valdez - R2, Sonia D. Domingo - R3, Irma W. Velarde - R4, Sirikit Dames Zafra – R5, Ma. Maureen F. Fortuna – R6, Helen Balbuena Albaño - R7, Mina Sirikit C. Tagra - R8, Jennifer Doroja-Araneta – R9, Ma. Imelda P. Carbajal – R10, and Veronica M. Deniega - R11 in the different projects and activities of the Committees on Bioethics, Patient Safety, Community Service, CME, Environment and Women's Health and Reproductive Health was echoed and shared for everyone to hear. Sharing the different experiences, empower regional cooperation and collaboration amongst the membership.

It was also fitting to give recognition and appreciation to the accolades our members and colleagues gathered and earned early this year. Indeed, these are the pride of the POGS:

The Excellence Award and Distinction Award for the Medical Education (government category) - Dr. Christia S. Padolina.

The 2022 Shan S. Ratnam Young Gynecologists Awards – Dr. Mark Antonio, Dr. Jimmy Awisa Billod and Dr. Mikaela Erlinda Bucu.

PMA Dr. Hermogenes A. Santos Memorial Award for CME - Dr. Lilia Pagtakhan-Luna. The 2021 JCI Senate Philippines (Phil Jaycees) and the PMA Award for the Outstanding Filipino Physicians - Dr. Melchor Dela Cruz (R2-Santiago City) and Dr. Maria Lourdes Otayza (R1-Ilocos Norte).

Our mother Society, the POGS being awarded by PMA this year, for the Certificate of Merit for its compliance in the submission of complete progress reports and a Testimonial of Merit as the Specialty Society with the most outstanding projects. We have always received this award since 2017.

An account of the scheduled plans and early accomplishments was steered by particular committees in the next segment of the meeting. This was led by the two institutional Committees of the POGS, the Philippine Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (PBOG) and the Council for Residents' Education, Enhancement and Development (CREED). The conduct and results of the 1st batch of the Part 2 (Oral) Diplomate examination in March handled by the Committee and its head Dr. Mario Philip R. Festin was reported by the Chairperson of PBOG, Dr Rey H. Delos Reyes. The second batch will still be conducted in August. He also mentioned the number of hospitals to be visited for accreditation this year and those carried over from 2021, with the Committee headed by Dr. Gina A. Macaranas and that due to the lowering of the Alert levels for Covid 19 on certain areas, the in person or face to face visits were already implemented starting April but still following the standard health protocols.





implemented this year commonly called the Provisional Accreditation of Residency Training Program (PARTP), which is headed by Dr Teresita C. Brion, is reviewing the requirements submitted by four hospitals out of the ten institutions who expressed their intent of applying for the new program.

The Committee on Part 1 (Written) Diplomate examination headed by the Dr. Teresa Diana B. Bongala is preparing for a face to face conduct of the examination on July 10, 2022. A Bioethics Forum for the new Diplomates is set to be ran on Sept 21, 2022 through the Committee on Ethics and Medical Practice.

For the CREED, its chairperson, Dr. Cynthia F. Tan, reported on the remote conduct of the hospital monitoring visits the Council carried on at the present time until when travel restrictions become more lenient. She also mentioned the preparations the Council was doing for the first Training of Trainors (TOT) Effective Online Teaching; "Tips and Tricks" which was successfully conducted last April 22-23, 2022. The Residency In Service Examination (RISE) will still be on an online format this year, set to be given on Sept 18, 2022. Both the PBOG and CREED will be revising their handbooks this year, being one of their major undertakings this year, which they aim to present and launch by the end of the year.

The POGS Committee on Mutual Assistance Program (CMAP), headed by Dr. Lilibeth L. Sia Su presented the approved the expanded scheme of the Sickness Benefit program of the Society aimed to ensure that all needs of our members are attended to appropriately as one of the major thrusts of this governance.

The integrated POGS HMO and PHIC Committee headed by Drs. Rowena M. Auxillios and Concepcion D. Rayel, respectively reported on the recently approved Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) of POGS with both the Association of Health Maintenance Organizations of the Phil. Inc. (AHMOPI) and the Phil. Association of Healthcare Maintenance Organization Companies (PAHMOC). The two related Committees collaborated and worked hard on the specifics of the MOA and the RVUs with the PHIC to help our members and patients reimburse appropriate benefits and shares from the health insurance companies. Both Committees work hand in hand in ensuring that the relative value units (RVUs) and case rates of the different Obstetrical and Gynecological conditions are competitive with the other organizations and recognized by the Insurance system.

Subsequently, Dr. Julieta V. Germar, Chair of the Committee on POGS Consensus Practice Bulletin, gave updates on issues to be published by the committee this year. She also provided us with a brief background description of the committee and the algorithm they follow in developing clinical consensus documents to provide up to date clinical guidance on emerging issues in our practice.

Dr. Annette M. Macayaon, Trustee and Chair of the Committee on Maternal and Perinatal Welfare, gladly shared another successful turn out of the virtual Celebration of the POGS National Buntis Day this year, in cooperation with the region host, Region 9 (Western Mindanao) headed by Dr. Jennifer D. Araneta. This year's theme was "Pagmamahal at Pag-aalaga kay pregnant Mommy para sa Masaya at Malusog na Baby". It was a very interactive event with a week long of activities via Zoom and FB live from March 7- 10 aired every 3pm which they called the "3PM habit" for the Buntis day. The culminating event was celebrated on the 10th of March, the same date it is being observed and commemorated annually. This would be the 18th celebration for the Society.

Dr. Ryan Capitulo, who chairs the two flagship projects of President Dr. Marlyn Dee for this year, reported on the accomplishments of the AdHoc Committee on Members' Mental Wellness and Motivation (M3) and AdHoc Committee of POGS Learning Management System (LMS). M3 was created

We all Rise as ONE this 2022!













Good day! It is my pleasure to invite everyone to this year's POGS 2022 Annual Convention and 76th Anniversary Celebration, a hybrid convention, which will


be held on November 8 to 11, 2022.

# The Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society celebrates the

# 18th National Araw ng mga Buntis (National Day for Pregnant Women)

he first Araw ng mga Buntis was held in 2004 under the POGS Presidency of Dr. Rosendo Roque who has been named as Father of the Araw ng mga Buntis. President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo issued Proclamation No. 569 s 2004 stating: "WHEREAS, the POGS, in coordination with the Department of Health aims to bring recognition to all pregnant women who are considered as heroes in their own rights by bringing another life into the world; WHEREAS, the POGS resolves to recognize this long neglected sector of the society with the-celebration of Araw ng mga Buntis, which will provide a concrete venue for information gathering, learning experience, stimulating discussion and challenging interactions... do hereby declare March 10 as Araw ng mga Buntis under the auspices of the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological (Foundation), Inc."

The second milestone achieved in this regard is on March 10, 2012 under the POGS Presidency of Dr. Rey delos Reyes when the Guiness World Records certified the Largest Prenatal Class held across multiple venues involving 13,047 participants organized by the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society in a total of 52 locations across the Philippines.

For 18 years now, the Araw ng mga Buntis is annually celebrated by conducting simultaneous activities all over the country such as providing free services including prenatal consultations, laboratory and ultrasound examinations. Lay fora and pageants are conducted to promote awareness of healthy pregnancies. Gift giving, caravans and motorcade are also done to highlight the event. The programs are organized by members of the organization, oftentimes in partnership with the local government agencies involving other healthcare providers like midwives and nurses.

When the pandemic struck last 2019, celebration by the host, region 3 was cancelled and it was moved to Novaliches in Metro Manila with a simpler manifestation. There was a decrease in the number of activities held all over the country because of the covid 19 restrictions. Last year, the social media platform was explored and a hybrid celebration was observed nationwide where small activities were done observing health protocols.

This year 2022, celebration of Araw ng mga Buntis in the Philippines achieved another milestone by reaching more than 800 viewers for 3 consecutive days at 3 o clock in the afternoon from March 7-9. The Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecologic Society broadcast in facebook a 1 hour lecture series. The 1 hour facebook livestream featured discussions of relevant topics to pregnant women recorded in a variety of format like direct presentation, panel discussion, testimonials and demo presentations. They were recorded by the corresponding 12 POGS regions throughout the country. The viewers on the 1st day of broadcast reached the highest number which is 1.1k with 800 viewers on the last day. The topics covered for the 3 day lecture series were: 1. Eat Healthy during Pregnancy; 2. Know your Philhealth Maternity Benefits; 3. Pregnancy Beauty Tips; 4. Social Media and Pregnancy; 5. Taking Care of the Newborn Baby; 6. Let's talk about Family Planning; 7. Exercises for the Pregnant Women - (Prenatal Yoga); 8. Mental health issues during pregnancy; 9. Breastfeeding still best for babies; 10. Debunking myths during Pregnancy; 11. Let's talk about Postpartum Depression; 12. Practical business tips

March 10, 2022 celebration was a live broadcast using the zoom platform. This was the culminating Araw ng mga Buntis Celebration for 2022. The members of the organization were in the platform interacting with the pregnant women watching the livestream in the public FB page of POGS. Numerous cash gift prizes were drawn and given to the pregnant mommy viewers plus baby clothes and cribs.. There was a feature presentation of the host, Region 9, a lay lecture on hypertension in pregnancy and a tiktok slide presentation of various activities done in the past.





■he Philippine Board of OB-GYN has been kept The PBOG Manual is also undergoing revision and updating busy with the year already halfway through. The Committee on Hospital Accreditation has fifty five (55) hospitals to visit, which includes those leftover from 2021, reaccreditation visits due for this year, and monitoring and mandatory visits. Initially done online, the teams are now doing their hospital visits face to face after restrictions have eased up in the regions.

The Diplomate Orals Examination last March was done online, and it was decided to continue the August Orals Examination online again. This allowed more panels to accommodate the examinees, removed the need for examinees to travel to Manila, and to be ready just in case health protocols suddenly change in the coming months.



Another big project of PBOG is the PARTP (Provisional Accreditation for Residency Training Programs in Obstetrics and Gynecology) a program hospitals seeking accreditation for the first time. This will be discussed more thoroughly in a separate article by its head Dr. Teresita Brion.

There will be a PBOG and Committee on Ethics Joint Forum to be conducted in September for the incoming Diplomates before their induction in November. It is the Board's hope that this year we will be able to hold the induction once again face to face so we can all welcome our new colleagues to our mother society.

# MRXUH Leads the 1st Batch of PARTP Applicants

Maria Reyna-Xavier University Hospital in Cagayan de Oro is the first hospital to start its journey towards full accreditation of its Residency Training Program (RTP) as PARTP PAP 1 Level. while two others, Cebu South Medical Center and Bataan General Hospital and Medical Center, follow closely behind with their respective Letter of Acceptance for PAP 0 Level.

The Provisional Accreditation for Residency Training Programs in Obstetrics and Gynecology (PARTP) is the newest program of the Philippine Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology. It provides a step-wise accreditation for RTPs not yet previously accredited but which already have established structures, processes and complete requirements for a regular Residency Training Program . It allows these RTPs to have preliminary accreditation for the infrastructures that are present even before they have appointed residents. It starts at PAP 0 when the RTP has NO residents yet but has complied with all the basic documentary requirements. The process progresses to PAP 1 when there is at least one resident up to a maximum of three residents. If evaluated by PBOG to have satisfactorily completed the first interim year with a newly-promoted second year resident from PAP 1 and a new first year recruit, the RTP progresses to PAP 2. It advances further to PAP 3 when there are newly-promoted third and second year residents from PAP 2 program and a newly-recruited first year. As the RTP moves to Level PAP 4, it should have the full complement of trainees with the newly-promoted fourth, third and second year residents and a newly-recruited first year. Provisional Accreditation Level 1 covers PAP 0, PAP 1, PAP 2, PAP 3 and PAP 4. An institution with a PAP 4 certification will qualify it to enter the Regular Accreditation Program and be considered as Fully Accredited

The development of PARTP was a long process. The seed was planted by the then-POGS President Mayumi Bismark (2017) who had been concerned about RTPs which were unable to seek accreditation because they lacked the required full complement of residents at the time of application. She directed 2017 PBOG President Conrado Crisostomo to consider formulating an alternative "leveling" scheme to accredit such programs. There was a period of hiatus thereafter until the idea was revived by 2020 PBOG President Ma. Lourdes Poblete-Chan who started working on the scheme for Provisional Accreditation of Residency Training Programs through its Special Project Committee. The work was endorsed to the next Board under the leadership of 2021 POGS President Benjamin Cuenca who, in turn, directed 2021 PBOG Chairr. Menefrida Reyes, to write the final draft of the PARTP. Dr Reyes, together with PBOG Secretary Dr. Josefina Morales and the PBOG Special Project Committee, composed of Dr. Maria Nellbyezz Calderon-Candelario (Committee Head), Dr. Helen Te-Santos and Dr. Teresita Cadiz-Brion, laid down the details for implementation. The draft was approved by the 2021 PBOG members who met en banc before it was presented to CREED and the BOT. The final draft\* was approved by the POGS BOT on November 17, 2021 and endorsed for implementation to the 2022 PBOG President Rey delos Reyes. He formed the 2022 Committee on PARTP composed of Dr. Teresita Cadiz-Brion (Head), Dr. Grace delos Angeles and Dr. Jo Ann Badua. In the process of implementation, it was deemed advantageous to more institutions if the Level IIB, and not just the original Level IIA hospitals, were included to qualify for application to PARTP. This was approved by the BOT on April 6, 2022, but it required a Level IIB with at least 600 deliveries per annum (at least 50 deliveries per month with 200 abnormal cases per annum) and at least 80 gynecologic operations per annum with or without an existing RTP. Ten hospitals initially applied and the three hospitals mentioned above were the hospitals who were able to comply with all the documentary requirements.

The PARTP document is in the POGS website and inquiries can be directed to PBOG.

# CREED Updates

CREED continued its work of monitoring the compliance of residency training programs with POGS standards. Five Year 3 hospitals were visited virtually from March-May 2022: Dr. Jose N. Rodriguez Memorial Hospital and Sanitarium, Mary Johnston Medical Center, General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital, San Juan de Dios Educational Foundation and V. Luna Medical Center. Perpetual Help Biñan was visited onsite (face to face) last May 23, 2022. In both remote/virtual and face to face/on-site visits, documentation of implementation of the training program were meticulously reviewed. For the second half of the year, 18 hospitals on their second year of re-accreditation are scheduled for monitoring visit.

The workshop on Blended Learning Strategies was conducted by Dr. Iris Thiele Isip-Tan who introduced the trainers to Video Production for Educators.

The second trainers meeting this year will be on September 30, 2022. The Committee on Workshop and Training headed by Dr. Nilo Alcoreza is preparing relevant topics on Incorporating Mental Wellness in the Residency Training Program, Navigating the POGS Learning Management System (LMS) and updates on the upcoming 2022 CREED Handbook.

## **POGS Northeastern Luzon on Environment and Women's Health**

rom the peak of the COVID-variant surges during the height of the pandemic in 2021 to the present months, the members of the Northeastern Luzon (Region 2) of the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society continued to plan and implement monitoring for health risk factors in pregnant and non-pregnant women, in the form of cervical cancer screening using visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA), PAP test and HPV DNA testing, as well as free prenatal check-ups and sonographic examinations. These were done in several localities in the provinces of Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino Province, Ifugao and the rest of the region. And in order to contribute to the increasing carbon-sink, as well as to help lessen the recurrence of extensive flooding in the low-lands of the region, members also increased tree-planting endeavors in barren lands and bamboos in riverbanks.

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology of the Cagayan Valley Medical Center (CVMC), Province of Cagayan in Region 2, was the site for the implementation of Department of Health (DOH) and Jhpiego Scale-Up Cervical Cancer Elimination with Secondary Prevention Strategy (SUCCESS) Project integrating the HPV-DNA testing and treatment of precancerous cervical cancer lesions. Clinical Skills Training (CST) Practicum was conducted last March 9-11, 2022 and Jhpiego donated loop electrosurgical excision procedure (LEEP) and thermal ablation equipment after the activities.

POGS NEL members also appeared in Radyo Pilipinas Tuguegarao (Tuguegarao City), Province of Cagayan to promote cervical cancer awareness in the province and neighboring towns.

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology of the Southern Isabela Medical Center in Santiago City conducts monthly visit for their "Adopt-a-Barangay" Project in Dallao, Municipality of Cordon, Isabela. Pre-natal and gynecologic check-up and counseling, cervical cancer screening using visual inspection with acetic acid and Pap Test, obstetrics and gynecologic ultrasound, feeding program and dental care, COVID-19 vaccination and counseling on breastfeeding, family planning and minimum health requirements for the prevention of COVID-19 transmission.

Women's Month was celebrated in the town of Jones Isabela Community Center in collaboration with the local government

Advance celebration of the Buntis Day for 2022 was observed in the Municipality of Dupax Norte in Nueva Vizcaya performing group counselling, prenatal checkups and scheduling for free obstetric ultrasound with distribution of prenatal minerals and vitamins. Radio promotion of the Buntis Day celebration was also done by the officers of the POGS NEL.

Prenatal check-ups and counselling, obstetric ultrasound and face-to face group lectures were conducted in Region 2 Trauma and Medical Center, Southern Isabela Medical Center and Cagayan Valley Medical Center, the three regional hospitals of the DOH in Region 2 from March 7 to 10.

This was attended by representative from all municipalities of the province including Municipal Health Officers, municipal nurses, barangay health unit midwives and Barangay Health Workers (BHWs).

# Region 11: Amidst the New Normalcy



The first face-to-face activity was held last March 26, 2022 at the Acacia Hotel, Davao City on Progestin Subdermal Implant Workshop sponsored by Organon with Dr. Eileen Grace Tancinco and Dr. Bernabe Marinduque as speakers and facilitators, participated by twenty-five (25) members and four (4) POGS-SMC officers This was followed by another face-to-face workshop last April 23, 2022 on Manual Vacuum Aspiration at Tsuru Japanese Restaurant in Davao City, sponsored by DKT Health with Dr. Rommel Z. Duenas as speaker and facilitator. Thirty-one (31) excited members and five (5) POGS-SMC officers attended the session.









Addressing mental health among members is both national POGS President Marlyn Dee's and POGS SMC President Karen Francisco's flagship project and concern. The Committee on Reproductive Health hosted a series of webinars on this topic. The first of the series entitled "Don't Bottle it Up! Mental Health on the Frontline" last April 30, 2022. 
