



Third Quarter Update

he biggest accomplishment of the CREED in the third quarter of 2023 is the well planned, well executed face-to-face residents' in-service examination (RISE) conducted on September 10, 2023. After three years of online examinations, a significant period in the history of CREED and POGS; 1,086 examinees nationwide trooped to five different venues for the RISE. Seven Hundred Sixty One (761) residents from the training programs of the National Capital region (NCR), and Regions 1-5 in Luzon took the RISE in the auditorium and classrooms of the University of Santo Tomas (UST) Faculty of Medicine and Surgery. One Hundred Ninety Seven (197) from the Visayas went to the Cebu Institute of Medicine (CIM) in Cebu City. Ninety (90) from Southern Mindanao took the RISE in the amphitheater of the Davao Medical School Foundation (DMSF) in Davao City. The two other testing venues in Mindanao were the Northern Mindanao Medical Center (NMMC) in Cagayan de Oro City where twenty-eight (28) examinees took the exam; and the Zamboanga City Medical Center (ZCMC) in Zamboanga City where ten (10) took their examination. Four of the fifteen CREED members traveled to the four examination venues outside NCR to proctor the examinations, ably supported by the Regional Directors and the local POGS Chapter officers. Current and past CREED and PBOG members proctored the 761 examinees in UST. The successful 2023 RISE was the result of a ten-month planning and execution by CREED, led by the Committee on RISE (COMRISE) Head, Dr. Maria Elsa E. Aquino and her team, and thoroughly supervised by CREED Chair Mary Jocelyn Yu-Laygo.

July and August 2023, preceded the RISE with the preparations that included six en banc meetings to critique and finalize the questions; confirmation of the venues, proctors, list of examinees and ID numbers, and updated instructions for the examinees.

In the same period, equally important efforts by the Committee on Workshop and Training (COMWAT) headed by Dr. Romerico F. Torres, focused on the groundwork for







the second Training of Trainers on September 29, 2023 with the theme: "Teaching Residents in Training: A Mini Tool Kit". It will be held in the Sheraton Hotel in Newport City. A new, exciting feature of the TOT is a Fellowship in the evening after the afternoon activity. The poster contains the topics and speakers.



Also in this quarter, the CREED through its teams of 3-4 members visited for monitoring, three year-3 and seven year-2 accredited residency training programs (ARTPs). One of four hospitals needing mentoring visits, was also visited this quarter, while the other three will be visited in the fourth quarter. Dr. Alpha S. Montaos leads this very busy committee, doing quiet but efficient, crucial work. The teams inspected the RTPs guided by the updated CREED checklist and gave recommendations based on the findings. The recommendations were deliberated in en banc meetings and reports submitted to the institutions and to the PBOG.







The work for the special project for this year, the updating of CREED's administrative manual and the Residents' Evaluation Forms (REFs), is almost complete. The contents of the Administrative Manual were perused and updated by the six-member technical working group (TWG) led by Dr. Ma. Geraldine R. Ramos. The final copy that will guide the coming years of CREED is expected by the end of the year.





An important undertaking initiated by CREED was the preparatory meeting among members of the PBOG, CREED, CHAS and PNSS held via Zoom on July 19, 2023. The PBOG and CREED presented their agenda consisting of updates and items for clarification elicited from the feedback and the questions raised by trainers during hospital visits. The CHAS also shared updates on the service accreditation process. Some agreements were reached while other items remained to be finalized. These were further discussed and validated during the quadripartite hybrid meeting on September 19, 2023, facilitated by BOT Secretary Dr. Leilani C. Coloma and attended by the POGS President, Dr. Efren Domingo and Vice-President, Dr. Mila Jocson with the other members of the BOT, PBOG, CREED and CHAS. PBOG Chair, Dr. Teresa Diana B. Bongala and CREED Chair, Dr. Mary Jocelyn Yu-Laygo were the main presenters on PBOG and CREED agenda, respectively. Dr. Charisse Sharon E. Tan reported on PBOG Hospital Visit requirements. Dr. Teresita Cadiz-Brion presented updates on the Provisional Accreditation of Residency Training Program (PARTP) and Dr. Pressie P. Eclarin enlightened the body on the Committee on Hospital Accreditation for Service (CHAS) and POGS Nationwide Statistics (PNSS) updates. The final output of this meeting, which are anticipated to be BOT- approved actions of PBOG and CREED, will be presented to the ARTPs during the TOT on September 29, 2023 and the POGS Hour during the Annual Convention in November 2023.



2021 POGS Report on Hospital Compliance and Total Admissions for 2019 to 2021

POGS Committee on Nationwide Statistics

(Explanatory note: Using the nationwide electronic census platform we call now as POGS Nationwide Statistics System or PNSS (through service provider Serious MD^R), "compliance" is defined as the submission of any data from patients admitted from each member hospital every month. The completeness or accuracy of the admissions per month cannot be confirmed by the system. Internal validation of the data is expected to be carried out by each member hospital.)

For the years 2019 to 2021, the PNSS has consistently showed good hospital with recorded births, the PNSS data is representative of only approximately 30compliance rates, as shown in the table below:

Year	Number of member hospitals in the PNSS	Number of hospitals with 100% compliance	Compliance rate
2019	147	135	91.85%
2020	168	158	95%
2021	187	166	89%

Prior to the PNSS, when hospital data submissions were mostly through paper reports and the Integrated Statistical Information System or ISIS, the number of accredited hospitals that consistently submitted data have been very poor, with compliance rates as low as 23.7%. 1,2

The improvement in compliance rates may be mostly due to the following factors: (1) an easier and more user-friendly electronic interface used by the PNSS, (2) efficient technical support provided by the service provider Serious MDR strict implementation and monitoring by the POGS Committee on Nationwide Statistics and the Committee on Hospital Accreditation for Service (CHAS), and (4) member hospitals increased usage of the data generated from PNSS, especially for lectures and research.


In 2022, the POGS Committee on Nationwide Statistics, then headed by Dr Annette Macayaon as chair, reevaluated and updated the PNSS, to improve the data collection, make it more comprehensive, and consistent with ICD-10 nomenclature.

For 2023, members of the POGS Committee on Nationwide Statistics, alongside members of the POGS Committee on Hospital Accreditation for Service (CHAS), visited some hospitals all over the country to check compliance with PNSS submissions. Dr. Jennifer del Prado visited Medical Center Manila, Adventist Medical Center Manila, The Doctor's Hospital, Bacolod, Central Luzon Doctor's Hospital - Tarlac and The Medical City - Clark; **Dr. Aurora Valdez** visited Cotabato Sanitarium and General Hospital, Dr. Jorge Royeca Hospital (General Santos City), Dagupan Doctors Villaflor Memorial Hospital, and Benguet General Hospital; Dr. Antonette Añonuevo visited Mary Mediatrix Medical Center, Calamba Medical Center, Cebu Puericulture Center and Maternity House, Inc., and Eversley Childs Sanitarium and General Hospital; and Dr. Ryan Capitulo visited Novaliches District Hospital and Philippine Children's Medical Center.

From the table above, we likewise see the increasing trend in the number of member hospitals that are included in the PNSS. However, this number represents only less than 10% of the total healthcare institutions in the country with recorded births. If we are to limit this to secondary and tertiary hospitals

35% of recorded births for the whole country.

The figure below shows the total number of cases recorded in the PNSS from 2019 to 2021:



We note here the decreasing trend in the number of recorded cases. This could mostly be a direct effect of the COVID-19 pandemic. With the declaration of nationwide, large-scale restrictions during the COVID-19 crisis, some POGSaccredited major institutions were converted to COVID-19 hospitals, and some hospitals operated at less than 50 percent capacity due to shortage of hospital staff. These reasons may have led to a precipitous decline in non-COVID-19 admissions starting first quarter of 2020.

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Committe on Environment and Women's Health

Members of the panel discussion were Dr. Maria Minerva Calimag, the current president of the Philippine Medical Association; Dr. Ronald Law, the DOH Chief Health Emergency Bureau; Dr. Paula Teresa Sta. Maria, Chairman of Philippine College of Physicians, Committee on Climate Change, Environment and Health; Dr. Ramon Lorenzo Luis Guinto, the Inaugural Director of the Planetary and Global Health Program at the St. Luke's Medical Center College of Medicine; Dr. Michael Velarde, Deputy Director for research and extension of Biology, University of the Philippines; Dr. May Anne Tabaquero, a member of the RDEH Subcommittee and Dr. Joanne Aguinaldo, the Chair of POGS Subcommittee on Climate Change and Disaster Risk Prepardeness.



April 20, 2023 - Earth Day Webinar: RDEH Cafe' Strengthening Reproductive and Environmental Health Advocacy

The second webinar was on Vegetable Urban Farming last August 23, 2023 from 8 – 10 am. This event was in partnership with ABS CBN Foundation. Several POGS Board of Trustees, Regional and Cluster representatives were sent seedlings and taught how to start and grow their own urban farming.



As part of the plan to strengthen ties with local organizations, subcommittee chair, Dr Ditas Decena, and member, Dr Angelica Fortaleza, attended the face-to-face Health Alliance for Climate and Clean Air Philippines (HACCAP) Policy Roundtable Discussion on "Together for Clean Air" last September 5, 2023 at the Lung Center of the Philippines. They were able to connect with fellow participants who share their commitment to addressing critical issues. A collective call to action of the health community in the Philippines demanding swift and decisive measures to address air pollution, climate change, and their impact on public health was also established by signing a statement of commitment as well the launching of three working groups for HACCAP: Research, Advocacy, and Awareness & Engagement.









Universal Healthcare in the Practice of Obstetricians and Gynecologists in the Philippines

UHC is an excellent platform for improving the health system of the country. It highlights and focuses on the potential of primary health care with the progressive realization that Service Delivery Network (SDN) is the main pillar to adopt. There is a need for the POGS to redefine its role in this context in order to be more relevant to the changing times.

he Philippines has taken a significant step forward in healthcare with the implementation of Universal Healthcare. This landmark law, otherwise known as the UNIVERSAL HEALTH CARE ACT (REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11223), signed by President Rodrigo R. Duterte last February 2019 has far-reaching implications for healthcare providers across the nation, including Obstetricians and Gynecologists.

The concept of UHC is not new. It dates back to the 19th century and through the years, several countries have used this to address pressing global problems. UHC is firmly based on the 1948 WHO Constitution: it declared health as fundamental human right and commits to ensuring the highest attainable level of health for all. On September 25, 2015, the UN General Assembly resolution on Transforming Our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development adopted the target of universal health coverage by 2030. It is interesting to note that for us, OB-GYNs, this includes: reduction of the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70/100,000 live births, ensuring universal access to sexual and reproductive health-care services, including for family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programs, and achieving universal health coverage, including financial risk protection, access to quality essential health-care services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all. The target date for these Sustainable Development Goals (SGD) is 2030.

A common question that healthcare providers usually encounter with the UHC Law is: what would this mean to the financial development of the Philippines? The 2017 National Demographic and Health Survey showed that 54.5 % of total health payment came from Filipinos' own pocket, the daily average for medicines and drugs is Php 5,237 and the average daily cost of treatment for confined individuals is Php 21,400. High out-of-pocket medical expenses push more people into poverty. When households spend more on hospital bills and medical treatments, they are forced to spend less on other necessities like food, housing, and education, which, some consider, are the drivers of any country's economy. The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA 2019) stated that 1.5 million Filipinos are impoverished due to catastrophic health spending.

Universal Health Care Act (Republic Act No. 11223) ushers in massive reforms in the health sector: the expansion of population, service, and financial coverage with an array of health system amendments and a paradigm shift to primary care, which will now be the core and center of all health reforms. The UHC will change the landscape of healthcare delivery and entirely overhaul the current system.

Accessibility to Care

One of the primary advantages of Universal Healthcare for OB-GYNs is increased accessibility to care. With a more comprehensive and inclusive healthcare system, more women, regardless of their socio-economic background, can access reproductive healthcare services. This leads to early detection and management of obstetric and gynecological conditions, ultimately improving women's health outcomes.

Preventive Services and Education

Universal Healthcare places a strong emphasis on preventive care and patient education. OB-GYNs can now engage in proactive measures to educate their patients on contraception, family planning, and prenatal care. This shift towards prevention not only reduces the burden of advanced diseases but also empowers women to make informed decisions about their reproductive health.

Streamlined Administrative Processes

UHC aims to simplify administrative processes that have historically plagued healthcare professionals. This streamlined approach allows OB-GYNs to focus more on patient care and less on administrative burdens, ultimately enhancing the quality of services provided.

Financial Sustainability

With the passing of UHC Act in 2019, PhilHealth is mandated to shift to a prospective payment mechanism based on Diagnosis Related Grouping (DRG). This is said to be more responsive to the complexity of patient needs, flexible to difference in resource among service capabilities and flexible to adjustments over periods of time. DOH-UHC Implementation Report Status as of June 2023 states that PhilHealth will also soon transition from the "No-Balance-Billing" (NBB) program to the "No Copay" and "Fixed Copay" initiative. "No Copay" program means zero out-of-pocket (OOP) expenses for members availing of benefits in basic accommodations (e.g. ward-type). The "Fixed copay" means paying a fixed amount to supplement PhilHealth's benefit package, instead of the varying costs presently charged by health facilities.

Collaborative Care

Universal Healthcare promotes a more collaborative approach to healthcare delivery. OB-GYNs are encouraged to work closely with other healthcare providers, such as midwives and community health workers, to ensure comprehensive care for pregnant women and those in need of gynecological services. This collaborative effort leads to better coordination and holistic patient care.

Challenges and Opportunities

While Universal Healthcare brings numerous benefits, it

also presents challenges. There is a need for workforce development and equitable distribution of healthcare professionals. Additionally, the transition to UHC may require adjustments in practice management and billing procedures.

Through all of these, the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society (Foundation), Inc. (POGS) through the POGS Organization of Government Institutions (POGI) has been running parallel with the Department of Health (DOH), Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (Philhealth), Philippine Regulation Commission (PRC) and other government agencies towards a smooth transition of the UHC and its full implementation in 2025. It has been conducting webinars and face-to-face meetings with stakeholders since 2021to guide all POGS members in this transition period. It has formulated the POGS-UHC Framework setting forth its General Objective of integration of the UHC into the POGS mission, vision and goals. Specifically, it is merging the UHC law mainly in the areas of training, governance, and setting standards in OB-GYN clinical practice, including primary care; determining the financial impact of UHC in OB-GYN practice and its members' collaboration with PHIC, HMOs, and other private health insurance companies mutually beneficial to its members, other healthcare workers (HCW) and the communities being served; establishing guidelines for an effective network of referral system among POGS accredited public/private training and service hospitals, POGS members practicing individually or with other healthcare workers and health facilities in the Health Care Providers Network (HCPN); and collaborating with DOH and PRC in defining the POGS role in governance and direction of primary health care program in the country.

The POGS has continued to monitor maternal health programs to lower the Philippine Maternal Mortality ratio (past 75 years). Though these programs were not linked directly to the present Universal Health Care (UHC) law, such programs served as preparation toward the full implementation of its principles into the POGS system, as stated by Dr. Ma. Theresa Vergara on the Primer on Service Delivery Network.

Conclusion

The implementation of Universal Healthcare in the Philippines marks a significant milestone in the country's healthcare landscape. OB-GYNs play a crucial role in the success of this healthcare transformation. As we adapt to these changes, we have the opportunity to make a profound impact on women's health, promote preventive care, and contribute to a more inclusive and equitable healthcare system. Through collaboration, education, and dedication, OB-GYNs can continue to provide exceptional care to women across the Philippines, ensuring a healthier and brighter future for all.

With this in mind, the committee, together with the Philippine Red Cross, held a Mass Casualty Incident Management Training (MCIM) Course last March 28-30, 2023. Online lectures were given by Mr. Donato C. Juan, EMT and Ms. Nashr'a S. Arichea, RN, EMT from the Philippine Red Cross. To further emphasize the role of POGS and its members in MCIM, case-based discussions were held the next day. A total of 419 POGS members from all over the country attended the online didactics. On the last day, a face-to-face tabletop exercise was conducted by the members of the Philippine Red Cross at the POGS building. As a finale to the training, a Simulation Exercise: The Big One participated by POGS members from various regions and the POGS secretariat was conducted, with the members of the Philippine Red Cross assisting the participants.

To further fortify the goals of the subcommittee, a strategic planning session was held on June 19-20, 2023 at SEDA Hotel BCG. The need to renew ties with previous partners was realized, as well as the identification of new partnerships was achieved.

At the heart of all the activities of the subcommittee, the Climate Change and Disaster Preparedness Annual Webinar was held on August 15 and 17, 2023. This was attended by 357 POGS members and allied medical professionals nationwide. Climate change and its Impact on Women's Health was discussed by Dr. Ramon Lorenzo Luis Guinto and the Role of the Obstetrician-Gynecologist in Mitigating and Adapting to Climate change was discussed by Dr. Alma Joy Morin. This was followed by the Climate Change and Disaster Preparedness Annual Hybrid Workshop on August 24, 2023 at the POGS building. The highlight of the day was the Ceremonial Renewal of Ties with the Department of Health represented by Ms. Belinda Evangelista and Mr. Mark Abrigo from the Philippine Red Cross.

The Board of Trustees, through the Committee on Mutual Assistance, is announcing the removal of the Covid-19 category from the Sickness Benefit Programme in accordance with Presidential Proclamation No. 297, dated July 21, 2023, which declares the lifting of the state of public health emergency throughout the Philippines due to Covid-19.

<u>Implementation process under Sickness Benefit Program:</u>

- 1) All applications for Mild and Moderate Covid shall be accepted until August 31, 2023. The completed application form and a copy of the RT-PCR Positive Test Result will still be required and the application period will be one year from the date of RT-PCR result.
- 2) Starting September 1, 2023, those who will be admitted due to Covid shall fall under the Medical Category either Non-Critical or Critical that requires 72-hour confinement as stipulated in the MAP guidelines.
- 3) Application forms can be downloaded from the Member's portal on the POGS Website and send through email at pogscmap@gmail.com

The fundamental Sickness Benefit Programs for Medical and Surgical Categories remain in effect and will be maintained. Rest assured that the POGS will continue to assist our ailing members through the Committee on Mutual Assistance Programme

The second face-to-face lay forum of the committee was conducted on July 13, 2023 at Marawi City in collaboration with the Committee on Community Service from 8:00 in the morning until 5:00 in the afternoon. Out of 1021 patients, 40 patients were screened. At the start of the program, 3 representative speakers from Region 10 delivered the modules.



The third face-to-face lay forum of the committee was conducted on August 4-6, 2023 at Ormoc City in collaboration with the Committee on Community Service from 8:00 in the morning until 5:00 in the afternoon. Out of 744 patients, 550 patients were screened.

The Ad Hoc Committee on Manila Declaration Call to Action Against Cervical Cancer continues the POGS Mission.

The Ad Hoc Committee on Manila Declaration Call to Action Against Cervical Cancer continues to gather the cervical cancer screening census of the various POGS-accredited institutions for training and service. For the second quarter, only 33 of the 158 (20.889%) submitted. The Committee is making an appeal to all institutions to submit the data. These data are meaningful to POGS as the data will be able to establish the trend and the coverage of cervical cancer screening that we as a Society is able to offer to the Filipino women. From here, the Society can devise ways to better our cervical cancer screening coverage and activities.



The third quarter also saw the first time that our educational videos about cervical cancer prevention were rolled out to our adopted community in Agusan del Sur. The videos were

cascaded to their youth using the school as a platform in their Cervical Cancer Awareness Advocacy Program.

In the National Capital Region, the Ad Hoc Committee participated in the Intensified Cervical Cancer Screening Campaign of the Metro Manila

Center for Health Development. Three townhall meetings with the lay as audience were held via Zoom during the month of September.



The Committee collaborated with the POGS Women First Committee with a sharing of educational videos during the meeting and answering the questions of the lay about cervical cancer screening.

As part of our commitment to the Asia Oceania Federation of Obstetrics and Gynecology in its advocacy of cervical cancer prevention for the region, Dr. Christia Padolina and Dr. Jean Anne Toral went to Vietnam to take part in their

OB-GYN national conference and imparting important aspects of cervical cancer prevention to our counterpart OB-GYNS of Vietnam.

Manila Declaration is also working on the second webinar of the AOFOG Cervical Cancer Elimination Program Committee, this time about HPV vaccination.

Task Force on Gender Based - Violence (GBV)

Position



The Task Force on Gender-Based Violence aims at addressing and combating gender-based violence in our society. For several reasons, the Task Force plays a critical role in our organization and our society as a whole. Gender-based violence is a pressing social issue that affects a significant portion of our population, particularly women and their children. Gender-based violence not only causes immediate harm but also long-lasting detrimental effects on the physical, emotional, and psychological wellbeing of survivors.

This year, the Task Force on Gender-Based Violence organized several initiatives and campaigns to raise awareness about gender-based violence, promote prevention strategies, and provide support to survivors. These initiatives included a two-day educational webinar workshop for the POGSaccredited institutions of Davao City, the workshop entitled "HOW TO ESTABLISH A VAWC DESK PART 1: HANDLING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND CHILDREN" participated in by OB-GYN Doctors, Social Service workers, and other healthcare professionals.

The first face-to-face workshop conducted was a two-part multidisciplinary team workshop on "VAWC Desk: Basic Guidelines for the OB-GYN" for the NCR Chapter. This was a two-day workshop participated in by OB-GYN Doctors, Nurses, and Social Workers from various hospitals and healthcare facilities in the National Capital Region Clusters.

The first run of the workshop took place on July 24 and 25, 2023 at POGS Assembly Hall, POGS Bldg. The workshop was participated in by Metro Rizal, Pentamed and Universitywide Clusters with almost 52 OB-GYN Doctors and 8 Social Workers attendees.

The second run of the workshop was held on July 31 and August 1, 2023 at POGS Assembly Hall, POGS Bldg. This time it was attended by CAMANAVA, CCI, and BAYCOG Clusters, with a total of 118 OB-GYN Doctors and 15 Social Workers.

The workshop on Anti VAWC conducted by the task force on Gender-Based Violence was a crucial step in raising awareness and addressing the pervasive issue of gender-based violence in our society. Not only did it bring together professionals from various healthcare disciplines, but it also empowered them with knowledge and tools to effectively address and respond to cases of violence against women and children.

POGI (POGS Organization of Government Institutions) POGS: Getting Ready to be Health Care Provider Network (HCPN) Partner for UHC Law

"Kalusugan para sa Lahat" is the battle cry of Republic Act No. 11223, known as the Universal Health Care (UHC) Act, which was signed into law in February 2019 and has become a national health policy. The law is aimed to protect and promote the right to health of all Filipinos, to instill health consciousness among them and to provide equitable access to comprehensive, quality, and cost-effective, promotive, preventive, curative, rehabilitative and palliative health services and goods while protecting against any financial risk.

The UHC Act provides a framework that entails a whole-of-system, whole-of-government and whole-of society approach in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of its programs, plans and health policies, while centering on the needs and well-being of the people and cognizant to the differences in values, cultures and beliefs.

What has POGS initiated and so far, accomplished in order to prepare its members for this national health program? Being the premier maternal and fetal health organization in the country, the Society, through the POGS Organization of Government Institutions (P.O.G.I.) and program H.E.A.L.T.H. (Health Education Aligning Lying-ins To Hospitals), consistently endeavors to ensure its commitment in promoting maternal health and perinatal medicine.

Since its launch in 2019, the P.O.G.I. readily forges collaboration with the different stakeholders in maternal and perinatal healthcare including those in the public and private tertiary hospitals and the leaders of allied professional organizations. Likewise, workshops were held with the POGS Board of Trustee, the members of the Philippine Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (PBOG) and the Council for Residents' Education, Enhancement and Development (CREED) on Safe Motherhood Program, the UHC Act, Service Delivery Network (SDN) or health care provider network (HCPN) and the integration of UHC law in OB-GYN practice.

In November 2022, the P.O.G.I.'s Primer on Service Delivery Network and Experiences with electronic



downloadable version, was made available to firm up the vision of the Society to be an assistive partner of the Department of Health in the full implementation of its HCPN programs. The primer describes what the P.O.G.I. is as a group under the POGS, its mission, vision and plans. The primer importantly highlights the different SDN experiences of some POGS members who championed with government health care institutions and their respective local government units.

SDN models are featured from the Quezon Memorial Medical Center, Rizal Medical Center, Navotas City Hospital, Eastern Samar Service Delivery Network, Southern Isabela Medical Center, Vicente Sotto Memorial Medical Center and Cotabato Regional and Medical Center.

This year, on its fourth year, the P.O.G.I. endeavors to set a standard of monitoring for the UHC-POGS Networks and SDN Programs with the integral stakeholders in the community. Cognizant of an expanded partnership that is crucial to the plan, the ad hoc committee pushes (1) to establish stronger collaboration with more health institutions with and without existing SDN, and (2) to define specific roles of POGS members in community Obstetrics and Gynecology with existing affiliations with lying-in clinics and midwives in their areas of practice. With these defined goals, the first workshop entitled Towards POGS Readiness to be a Health Care Provider Network (HCPN) Partner was conducted on April 25, 2023 at the POGS Assembly Hall, participated by the sixteen (16) core members of the committee with eleven (11) invited POGS members, all HCPN enthusiasts from the various health institutions in NCR, Region 3 and Region 4 like Dr. Jose N. Rodriguez Memorial Hospital,

Dr. Paulino J. Garcia Memorial Research and Medical Center, James L. Gordon Memorial Hospital, Bataan General Hospital and Medical Center, Jose B. Lingad Memorial Regional Hospital and Dr. Damian Reyes Provincial Hospital. The activity produced objective guidelines to assess the level of involvement of the POGS-accredited institutions for training and for service in the HCPN of their respective local government units (LGUs).

The POGS appreciates the fact that once UHC law is in its full implementation, there will be attendant adjustments in the OB-GYN practice that will be inevitable. As a Society, therefore, to prepare the members for such development becomes a top priority. Hence, another workshop was held on August 10, 2023, entitled Towards POGS Readiness to be a Health Care Provider Network (HCPN) Partner v 2.0: P.O.G.I. workshop with the POGS Private (Sector) Practitioners.

At least nineteen (19) private OBGYN practitioners from the NCR, Regions 3 and 4 (including those representing The Medical City (TMC), Victor R. Potenciano Memorial Medical Center, World Citi Medical Center, University of Santo Tomas, Capitol Medical Center, Dr. Jesus C. Delgado Memorial Hospital, St. Luke's Medical Center-Quezon City, Marikina Valley Medical Center, University of Perpetual Help Medical Center-Las Piñas, Providence Hospital, Far Eastern University- Nicanor Reyes Medical Foundation (FEU-NRMF) Medical Center, Bocaue Specialist Medical Center, Angeles University Foundation Medical Center, Adventist Hospital Palawan, De La Salle University (DLSU) Medical Center, and Perpetual Help Medical Center - Biñan) were invited to formulate a balanced matrix to scale up readiness of the private sector using the

UHC's Domains of Network of Care.

Eight steps on how a private institution can be HCPN partner ready: During the workshop, the participants analyzed and identified the who, what, where, when, and how of each of the 8 steps proposed by P.O.G.I. to make their respective institutions HCPN partner ready. The proposed steps were the following:

- Establishment of a fully functional primary care unit (PCU) inside the hospital defining primary care services including health promotion activities.
- 2. Identification of existing primary care facilities and primary care provider in the community to partner with.
- Establishment of Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) which will contain the standards and guidelines for the partnership signed by both parties
- Defining the referral parameters using the risk assessment tools guided by the subspecialty societies.
- 5. Establishment of the inward and outward referral flow.
- Using the domain of networks of care as a guide in the HCPN networking.
- Establishment of an effective quality control program for the referral system.
- 8. Ensuring proper documentation and analysis of statistics to measure success of program.

The Medical City Initiative: The TMC Institute for Women's Health (IWH), one of the invited participants in the P.O.G.I. workshop v2.0 for the private sector, has been working on a SDN model in Pasig City. Dubbed as Sibol Pinay Project, the vision is to establish a collaborative prenatal care model between TMC IWH and the soon-to-open community birthing center of the Rotary Club of Pasig (RCP), the Rotary Club of Pasig Multispecialty Lying-in Clinic. The whole project is the brainchild of RCP 2017-2018 President, Dr. Jesus B. Acantilado, which was placed under the TMC IWH Community Service Committee, chaired by Dr. Concepcion P. Alfiler and Dr. Marivic C. Agulto-Mercadal as the project head, with the guidance of TMC IWH Director Dr. Zarinah G. Gonzaga.





POGI (POGS Organization of Government Institutions)

The project is a realized offshoot of the long-term partnership of TMC with the RCP Ilugin Community Center in Pasig City that was established since August 2015. The construction of a 3-storey multispecialty lying-in clinic started in 2019, which will house four (4) delivery room beds, two (2) labor room beds and one 5-bedded ward, along with a basic laboratory facility, an ultrasound unit with radiology services. Multispecialty outpatient clinics will also be available for the Pasigueños.

The target completion of entire facility is end of 2024, with the mission to provide (1) shared prenatal care and postpartum care, where OBGYN resident trainees will be able to provide prenatal and postpartum care alongside the midwives, including consultations, childbirth, and parenting education; (2) shared group care on specific clinical interests, where OBGYN resident trainees will be able to provide patient education and counselling on specific clinical interests such as adolescent/youth sexual health, reproductive health, gender health and wellness, maternal mental health and well-being, menopause and other gynecologic diseases, to name a few; shared on-call responsibilities, where OBGYN trainees will share responsibilities to attend labor and births at the community birthing center, as needed through an established oncall schedule; and (4) continuity of carer, where OBGYN trainees will attend to patients from the RCP Multispecialty

Lying-in Clinic in need of antepartum or intrapartum transfer to a tertiary facility, under the Divine Mercy Service Program of TMC.

Through such undertaking, the IWH and RCP aspires to help reduce maternal and neonatal morbidity and mortality by increasing the number of births attended by skilled birth professionals while providing accessible services for sexual and reproductive healthcare in the target locality.

The Sibol Pinay Project is a private sector

initiative that will steer community engagement within the current local health system, in anticipation of the full implementation of the UHC law. The project envisions to provide the women of Pasig and nearby towns the optimum chance to blossom and have quality and accessible healthcare.

The government and private health sectors vary greatly not only in administration and operations, but likewise in financing, service delivery and target populations to serve. Creating a model for HCPN in the

private sector that is similar to the existing SDN models in the government sectors is truly a formidable task that requires genuine commitment and utmost perseverance from the whole organization of any private institution.

And looking at the whole landscape, it is obvious that the impact of the UHC in the private sector is not just limited to the practice of our specialty but will also affect greatly the training of residents and fellows, especially in the private institutions. The POGS leaders, the P.O.G.I., the CREED, the PBOG and other relevant internal committees have enormous tasks to surmount so that substantive decisions will be made to strike the balance of benefits and risk during UHC's full implementation.

The P.O.G.I.'s initiatives to promote awareness among POGI members and to prepare the POGS as a society for UHC will endure, with its sixteen (16) core members and 42 auxiliary members assigned in all 12 regions of the country. The committee's hope is to eventually see more and more POGS members in passionate HCPN engagement with their respective LGUs. The POGS' P.O.G.I. will continue to stand and assert its role as a catalyst to optimize progressive change in maternal and perinatal health, steered by the POGS members, to bring down maternal mortality rate and achieve a program of healthcare



Philippine Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology

As part of the 9-point plan of the PJOG for capacity-building for medical editors and reviewers, the Philippine Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology (PJOG) Editorial Board organized a virtual Technical Peer Review Short Course and Critical Appraisal Workshop last July 8 and July 15, 2023. This was conducted by Dr. Jose Florencio F. Lapeña, Jr., former President of the Philippine Association of Medical Journal Editors (PAMJE). It was an intensive, comprehensive 8-hour short course on the scientific peer review of biomedical research for

referees of protocols and manuscripts submitted for implementation and future publication in peer-reviewed journals. The session had 6 lectures on the first day. What followed was practical application of the process with group work critiquing 2 actual submissions to the PJOG.

The two (2) Saturdays workshop was attended by 38 guest reviewers from the different subspecialty and affiliate societies of POGS and by the Editorial Board members of PJOG.

PJOG is also happy to share with the POGS community that PJOG got its certificate of indexing with active status from the National Journal Selection Committee (NJSC). The NJSC annual meeting was conducted last June 05, 2023. It reviewed the status of Philippine Journals indexed in the Western Pacific Region Index Medicus (WPRIM). PJOG remains indexed with WPRIM for 2023. More work needs to be done as PJOG aims for indexing in the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) next.

As part of the 9-point plan of PJOG also of having editorials and perspective articles by invitation, there have been 2 editorials so far. The topics are very relevant to us obstetrician-gynecologist members of POGS. The first one was written by POGS President Efren J. Domingo on "the obstetrician-gynecologist as a researcher with integrity" (part of the first issue for 2023). This was followed by the editorial cowritten by Dr. Maria Lourdes Otayza and Dr. Virgilio Novero, Jr., prime movers of the POGS research agenda, on "developing of a culture of research in the POGS through the POGS Unified Research Agenda" (part of the second issue for 2023). The first perspective article on "Precision Medicine in Gestational Trophoblastic Diseases" was penned by Dr. Agnes L. Soriano-Estrella as part of the special issue of the Philippine Society for the Study of Trophoblastic Diseases (PSSTD). The PSSTD special issue is the first issue by a subspecialty society for the year. PJOG encourages other subspecialty societies under the POGS to come up with their specialty issues as well.

PJOG continues to invite the members, OB-GYN Residents and Subspecialty Fellow-in-Training, and all others with special interest in Obstetrics and Gynecology to submit their original researches, case reports, and other scientific works for publication in the PJOG.

ANG PANGAKO: GLOSARYO NG OBSTETRICS AT GINEKOLOHIYA

The POGS Filipino Glossary of Obstetrics and Gynecology is one of the flagship endeavors under the PANGAKO Presidential Projects for 2023. It aims to publish a handbook of commonly used Filipino Ob-Gyn terms, primarily for use by our colleagues, to encourage the use of the Filipino language in everyday patient encounters. This endeavor also hopes to develop consistency in the use of various Filipino obstetrics and gynecology terms in scientific paper writing.

The editorial team underwent a whole-day workshop on glossary construction last March. The entries have undergone editing and is undergoing proofreading by our adviser and collaborator Prof. Schedar Jocson, Chair of the University of the Philippines Diliman Department of Filipino and Philippine Literature.

The final draft will be presented to the Board of Trustees for approval. We aim to launch the handbook in the POGS Annual Convention in November and distribute copies to POGS accredited institutions all over the country.








Region 6 – PANAY CHAPTER Third Quarter Activities

I. LECTURE SERIES FOR CLINICAL CLERKS AND POSTGRADUATE INTERNS

A. The modernization of industrial development and technology in the last few decades have impacted the everyday lives of the average people all over the globe – from ubiquitous use of plastic bags, disposable medical equipment, to accessible beauty products. Life, indeed, was made easier. However, these changes also brought about global waste problems, climate change and growing medical concerns such as hormonal imbalance, metabolic disorders, neurological diseases, pregnancy complications and even cancer.

In the recent years, two of the most common concerns of Filipinas in the Southern Tagalog Region are hormonal imbalance and metabolic disorders, particularly Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome and Diabetes.

The POGS STC Subcommittee on Reproductive and Developmental Environmental Health aims to tackle this concern by promoting awareness on holistic approach to women's health among our younger colleagues from the Medical Schools in the region. A lecture series on 1. Endocrine Disrupting Chemicals and its relation to Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome and 2. Balanced Nutrition for Women were coordinated with the De La Salle Medical and Health Sciences Institute and Perpetual Help Medical Center Biñan.



The locality was chosen because it was struck by a Tornado early this year and approximately ≥40 houses were damaged. The community were taught on how to make Atsara and Flavored Coated Peanuts as an option for their livelihood.

The productive workshop took place on August 26, 2023, running from 8:00 Am to 4:00 PM, and was hosted at the Roxas Hall withing the West Visayas State University College of Medicine.

POGS-CLC Holds 2023 CME in Collaboration With AOGIN

More than a hundred members of the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society-Central Luzon Chapter (POGS-CLC) attended the 2023 AOGIN Medical Education on 26 August 2023 at the Xenia Hotel, Clark despite the inclement weather. This goes to show that the members' commitment to medical innovation and advancement can take place no matter what the circumstances are.

This year's Continuing Medical Education (CME) was made possible through the collaboration of POGS-CLC with the Asia-Oceania Research Organisation on Genital Infections and Neoplasia (AOGIN)-Philippines, an organization that envisions reducing the burden of disease caused by reproductive tract infections, especially HPV, in the Asia, Oceania and Pacific region.

The CME session highlighted two topics that aim to provide updates on managing gynecologic infections and caring for women's reproductive health.

The first part, entitled "Paradigm Shift in Cervical Cancer Screening and Prevention, was facilitated by Dr. Gladdy Maura G. Facun, Chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology of Tarlac Medical Center.

Dr. Facun extensively discussed HPV testing as the new recommendation in cervical cancer screening. Apart from this, she also presented the utility of the old screening methods such as Papsmear and visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA). The insights and recommendations she has provided about the advantages and clinical application of these methodologies served as a welcome development for practitioners to innovate and develop further their practices in the field.

Commented [MAI]: Dr. Facun extensively discussed the new recommendation in cervcial cancer screening whihc is primary HPV testing. She also discussed the utility of the old screening methods, the Paps smear and visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA). Through her lectures, the attendees were able to understand the rationale and advantages of the new screening methodology. She was also able to discuss the clinical application of different screening methodology in our local practice.

The second part of the CME was facilitated by an assistant professor at the University of the Philippines College of Medicine and Consultant at the Philippine General Hospital Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Dr. Florida F. Taladtad, with the topic Revisiting Common Gynecologic Infections: Updates on Management.

Dr. Taladtad's segment was a high-yield review and masterclass on the very broad topic of Genital Infections. She was able to pack in basic but extremely important information and clinical pearls helpful in clinical practice. Her lecture served as a very good review for our residents-in-training as well.

An industry-sponsored lecture on the utility of oral contraception was given by Dr. Ana Dy Echo who also gave time answering questions regarding OCPS and its effects on HPV and genital infections.



INAUGURAL NATIONAL TROPHOBLASTIC DISEASES AWARENESS WEEK SHEDS LIGHT ON WOMEN'S HEALTH

On August 22-25, 2023, the Philippine Society for the Study of Trophoblastic Diseases (PSSTD) launched the first-ever "National Trophoblastic Diseases Awareness Week" under the theme: "Kalinga, Kadamay, Katropa." The primary objective of this event was to launch awareness of this disease and to disseminate updated Clinical Practice Guidelines for the management of Hydatidiform Mole. It aimed to foster collaboration among allied medical professionals, general practitioners, and Trophoblastic diseases specialists to advance evidence-based care for women with these conditions.

The National Trophoblastic Diseases Awareness Week commenced on August 22, 2023, from 4-6 pm, through a virtual forum on Zoom entitled **"Who are the people in the neighborhood?"**A Lay Forum on Trophoblastic Diseases for Patients, Caregivers, and Doctors. The forum featured three distinguished speakers: Dr. Honorota Lalaine P. Burog, a Trophoblastic Disease Specialist, who discussed Hydatidiform mole and its management; Mrs. Tatialen Crishziel S. Gozon-Talaver, who shared her personal experience as a patient with hydatidiform mole and Mr. Romark Zuniga, the husband of a GTN patient, who shared his personal journey of taking care of his wife and expressed his gratitude for all the trophoblastic diseases specialists who are involved in the care of his wife. The forum attracted 305 attendees, making it a resounding success in raising awareness.

On August 23 and 24, 2023, participating hospitals and institutions hosted lectures on the latest Clinical Management Guidelines for Hydatidiform Mole set forth by the Philippine Society for the Study of Trophoblastic Diseases. Lingad Memorial General Hospital, Mariano Marcos Memorial Medical Center, Northern Mindanao Medical Center, POGS CAMANAVA, Region 1 Medical Center, Region 2 Trauma and Medical Center, San Juan de Dios Educational Foundation Inc. Hospital, Southern Isabela Medical Center, Southern Philippines Medical Center, and Vicente Memorial Medical Center.




