Year End Report

The recently concluded Annual Convention and POGS 77th Anniversary

reetings of joy and love this holiday season.

Celebration was indeed a success having been attended by 6,308 delegates from the different regions, including International registrants. This total number was composed of 458 Junior members, 524 Diplomates, 3029 Fellows, 12 Associate members, 511 Life members, 1,116 non- members, 647 Resident physician trainees, and 11 International delegates.

This year, we were able to welcome 294 newly inducted Fellow members and 225 Diplomates in our roster. Moreover, the POGS conferred the distinction of Honorary Fellowship upon Jeanne Conry, MD (FIGO President) and Pisake Lumbiganon, MD (AOFOG President). Both of whom are distinguished physicians in their national societies and have contributed meritorious services to the various projects and activities of the POGS. They have gained International recognition as well in the field of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Their distinction is brought about by their performance of extraordinary humanitarian services in the field of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

The six (6) proposed items for amendments in the Constitution and By Laws were ratified by the general membership, during the election conducted last November 9, 2023 with the suspension of the rules on election during the Annual Business meeting.

The proposed items garnered majority votes accordingly.

These include (1) Inclusion of Article 4 in the Constitution – Code of Ethics (96%), (2) Article IIIB Committee on Awards – to give a title on the Award for Excellence in Clinical Practice as Dr. Julita R. Jalbuena Award for Excellence in Clinical Practice (96%), (3) in the By Laws- Article IV – Constitutional Committees, to include the Committee on Ethics and Medical Practice (97%), (4) Make the composition and functions of the Committee on Ethics and Medical Practice under Section 6 of Article IV – Constitutional Committees (97%), (5) Election

Code, Article III – Committee on Nominations, to amend that in Section 2.3 It shall nominate at least 15 Fellows from all NCR sectors (96%), (6) Election Code, Article III Nominations – that a nominee who have retired or resigned from their service institution must be given the privilege to choose the sector that he/she will represent. (96%)

The Board congratulates the new set of officers and members of the BOT elected for 2024, after a streamlined and efficient online election process.

Similarly, the Board recognizes the exemplary leadership of President Efren J. Domingo. We are grateful for the gentle and transparent way he had led the Society in facing the hurdles that came its way. Equally commendable are all the efforts and hard work done by the 2023 members of the Board of Trustees.



The Pioneering Work of the Task Force on Immunization for Women:

A Symopsis

n an age where public health and individual well-being have taken center stage globally, the importance of vaccination cannot be overstated. As a protective measure against a multitude of diseases, vaccines play an indispensable role in sustaining health and fortifying societies against outbreaks and pandemics. Women, being at the heart of the family structure and often primary caregivers, constitute a significant group within this context. Addressing their unique health needs, particularly in relation to immunization, is therefore of paramount importance.

The reproductive health program of the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society (POGS) has been consistently pushing the frontiers of women's health in the Philippines. In recent years, a task force was established to concentrate on the critical area of immunization for women. Their efforts have culminated in a series of six lectures that were designed to explore various facets of this complex subject matter.

Within this backdrop, the reproductive health program of the Philippine Obstetrical and Gynecological Society (POGS) has initiated a formidable response. Recognizing the need for a dedicated approach to women's immunization, POGS established a task force to concentrate on this critical area. Through a series of enlightening lectures, this task force, aptly named the "Task Force on Immunization for Women," sought to shed light on various aspects of immunization as it pertains to women's health, from adolescence to the menopausal stage.

Vaccinating our Pregnant Women: Updates - The first lecture, which took place in Western Visayas on February 7th, was delivered by Dr. Maria Lorena Santos. Updates on the current trends and protocols for vaccinating pregnant women were provided. The lecture was instrumental in bringing to light the importance of immunizing this vulnerable population to protect both maternal and neonatal health. The same topic was shared to our colleagues in Central Luzon last April 25.

Role of Maternal Immunization in decreasing neonatal morbidity - On March 22, Dr. Sybil Bravo gave an insightful lecture in the NCR on the significant role maternal immunization plays in decreasing neonatal morbidity. The lecture underscored the undeniable connection between the health of the mother and child, emphasizing the importance of maternal vaccinations in safeguarding newborn health.

Latest Updates on the Covid-19 Vaccines for our Women - Dr. Helen Madamba provided a timely and relevant discussion on June 6 in Cebu regarding the latest updates on Covid-19 vaccines for women. Her talk delved into the efficacy, safety, and necessity of COVID-19 vaccination, focusing on its implications for women of various age groups.

Immunizing our Adolescents: Its Relevance to our Practice as ObGyns - Dr. Maria Lorena Santos took the lead once more on August 22 in Region 2 (Cauayan, Isabela). This time her lecture focused on the importance and best practices of immunizing adolescents. The lecture was a vital guide to the vaccination protocol for this age group, addressing their unique physiological and psychological needs.

Vaccinating Women in their Reproductive and Menopausal Years - Lastly, on September 19 in Davao, Dr. Judith Faye M. Montero spoke on the importance of vaccinating women during their reproductive and menopausal years. She elucidated the significance of a tailored vaccination plan for women in these stages of life, given the changing physiological landscape and associated health risks.

The series of lectures conducted by the Task Force on Immunization for Women has set a new precedent in the realm of women's healthcare. Their focus on

comprehensive immunization for women across all life stages, starting from adolescence to the reproductive years and into menopause, underscores the need to prioritize this aspect in overall healthcare planning and provision. These discussions have not only raised awareness but also ignited conversations about women's health, vaccination, and the interconnectedness of these elements. They have shed light on the nuances of women's health, illustrating that an allencompassing, one-size-fits-all approach to healthcare is not always adequate. Their work emphasizes that women's healthcare needs evolve and change through different life stages, requiring specific considerations and approaches.

As a final point, the Task Force on Immunization for Women's effort to consolidate and disseminate relevant, up-to-date, and evidence- based information has been a key step in promoting optimal health outcomes for women. It is our hope that this initiative inspires and informs similar endeavors locally, in the collective effort to enhance women's health and, by extension, the wellbeing of our communities. Their work serves as a testament to the power of informed healthcare and the profound impact it can have on society.



ne of the goals of the Task Force, PREPARE is the women, especially adolescent girls to prevent early pregnancy. By Providing comprehensive sex education, access to contraception, and support services, Task Force PREPARE aims to empower women to protect themselves from the consequences of early pregnancies and to make informed choices about their reproductive health.

Using a multi-faceted approach, task force PREPARE recognizes that addressing the complex issues surrounding early pregnancy requires not only education of young women about contraception and reproductive health, but also need to address the social, economic, and psychological factors that contribute to early pregnancies.

The task force organized several lectures from all over the regions in different sectors such as schools and other rural areas with the help of our POGS Regional Directors and PREPARE warriors. The recent lecture and last for this year organized by the task force was on October 27, 2023, at Saint Augustine Academy, Coron Palawan. It was attended by more than 500 high school and senior high students and 10 teachers.

The interactive lecture provided crucial information about sexual education and reproductive health, including physiological and emotional changes, relationship status, and the importance of reproductive health contraception. The lecture was spearheaded by Dr. Diosdado V. Mariano, Task Force, Chairperson and Dr. Anna Belen Ignacio-Alensuela, Project Director of Task

Critical Appraisal of Topics (CATS) Masterclass

his Critical Appraisal Masterclass for OBGYN consultants provides comprehensive knowledge and skills on how to evaluate clinical papers. It is a one-and-a-half-day event. Assigned members of the 2023 Scientific Committee prevailed as expert instructors and covered essential components of critical appraisal of articles on diagnosis, therapy, systematic reviews, meta-analyses, prognosis, and or harm. To enhance understanding, didactics on study design, bias, and confounder, and statistical analysis are likewise provided. By the end of the course, attendees will have the tools and confidence to evaluate clinical papers with a critical eye and make evidence-based decisions in OBGYN practice.

There were 4 runs or cascades of this CATS masterclass that kept the 2023 Scientific Works Committee engaged with fervor. The following were the dates, venues, and regions served: July 1-2, 2023 for NCR and Region 4 at Crowne Plaza Hotel; August 12-13, 2023 Regions 1, 2, 3, and 5 at Quest Hotel Angeles City; August 19-20 Regions 6, 7, and 8 (Visayas) at Seda Hotel, Ayala Center Cebu City; and September 22-23, 2023 Regions 9, 10, and 11 (Mindanao), at Seda Hotel Davao City.

It cannot be overemphasized the potential impact of flawed research on clinical decision-making; thus, the importance of evidence-based practice in OBGYN. At the outset, the strengths and limitations of each study design in OBGYN research were embarked upon. This was followed by a didactic on how to identify and minimize bias and confounders in OBGYN research. The attendees were trained on how to identify the key features of high-quality systematic reviews and meta-analyses and appraise the quality using established criteria. Didactics also included appraising previously e-mailed articles on diagnosis, therapy, prognosis, and or harm. Pretest and post-test were given to earn the valuable CPD units.

In the afternoon of the 1st day, there were 4-5 "café" stations where participants had small group targeted mentoring. Respective lecturers facilitated the critical appraisal of a second set of previously provided journal articles on Systematic Reviews and Meta-analysis (Dr. Lylah D. Reyes/Dr. Koleen C. Pasamba), Diagnostic Accuracy Study (Dr. Noel L. Espallardo), Therapy (Dr. Judith M. Sison / Dr. Faye Cagayan in the NCR/Region 4 group), Prognosis (Dr. Jean Anne B. Toral/Dr. Richard Ronald B. Cacho).

In the morning of the 2nd day, there were discussions on Shared Decision by Dr. Noel L. Espallardo and Common Statistical Tests by Dr Judith M. Sison as a springboard for interpreting statistical results in OBGYN research. This was followed by the presentation of participants of their group work. The challenging part was everyone came prepared to present since only after drawing lots will the precentor be known. Indeed, it was a fun-filled learning workshop activity! The mentors appreciate how the mentees imbibe their newly acquired credentials.

WORKSHOP ON RESEARCH PROTOCOL WRITING

esearch activity remains to be an integral part of residency training because it promotes critical thinking and allows future specialists to have an appreciation of evidence-based medicine. Residents who are proficient in research training also have been shown to have better clinical competence scores and may encourage interest in pursuing a clinician-scientist career. Because of this, a one-day workshop on Research Protocol Writing for OB GYNE Residents was organized by the POGS Committee on Scientific Works with the following faculty as the main facilitators - Dr. Maria Stephanie Fay Cagayan, Dr. Yvonne Soriano, DR. Marjorie Santos and Dr. Debby Songco. To cater to the regional membership of POGS, these series of one day workshop were held on the following dates and places:

The main objective of the workshop is to help residents think of timely and relevant topics for inquiry and improve their capsule proposals through defining research terms and reviewing the parts of the protocol. The activity also aimed to motivate and prepare the residents to conduct collaborative work in their respective professional institutions and to discuss how to translate research into impact. Tips were also given by the different facilitators to make their protocols able to pass the eagle-eyed scrutiny of technical and ethics committee members of their departments and institutions.

Each event was started with an inspirational speech by the indefatigable POGS President, Dr. Efren J. Domingo followed by a welcome remark from the chair of the committee, Dr. Rommel Z. Duenas. Most of the participants were second and third year residents who have already received some research training in the past and were now ready to apply these learnings into actual conduct of research. The workshop provided an innovative approach to improving their works as residents were asked to bring to the table their proposals for critique by their peers as well as by the facilitators.

Almost all participants expressed satisfaction with the conduct of the workshop and gave feedback that the activity significantly helped them improve their ongoing work. Some residents decided to totally revamp their ideas and choose more feasible projects based on recommendations by their colleagues.

Research activity remains to be an integral part of residency training because it promotes critical thinking and allows future specialists to have an appreciation of evidence-based medicine.







Byaheng Menopause sa Bicol!



efying forecast of heavy rainfall, the morning of 22 October 2023 saw the sun cast its golden rays over the Albay Gulf as the Mayon Volcano unraveled her grandeur against a pristine blue sky: a perfect backdrop for the World Menopause Day celebration in Region V.

As the main celebrating region this year, 246 participants, both lay and medical advocates for mature woman care gathered at the Legazpi Marker. The celebration was formally opened by the mayor of Legazpi City, the Hon. Carmen Geraldine Rosal. This was followed by a Welcome Address by Dr. Maria Jesusa Banal-Silao, the president of the Philippine Society of Climacteric Medicine (PSCM). PIDSOG's Campaign for Inclusive Vaccination in Maternal Care: Building Strong Alliances for a Healthier Future

In an impactful session with the House of Representatives' Committee on Health, the Philippine Infectious Disease Society for Obstetrics and Gynecology (PIDSOG) presented a robust case for the integration of Influenza and Tdap vaccinations into the maternal healthcare regimen. This move, aimed at elevating the standard of prenatal care in the Philippines, is a part of a broader effort to enhance maternal and child health services.



The Critical Need for Maternal Vaccinations:

Influenza and Tdap vaccinations are critical for protecting pregnant women and their newborns from severe health risks. The Influenza vaccine guards against serious respiratory complications that can occur during pregnancy, while the Tdap vaccine is essential for preventing illnesses like whooping cough in infants. By vaccinating mothers, we extend protection to their babies, offering them a safer start in life.



PIDSOG's Advocacy and Strategic Approach:

Our advocacy at PIDSOG, which I presented as President, is deeply rooted in a wealth of scientific research affirming the safety and effectiveness of these vaccines in pregnancy. We drew on global health data and successful international models to underscore the importance of including these vaccines in maternal healthcare programs.



Building a Collaborative Effort:

A pivotal aspect of our campaign is the collaboration with key allies. A recent milestone in this journey was the House of Representatives (HRep) Committee on Health, chaired by Batanes Rep. Ciriaco Gato, Jr., approving the consolidation of eleven bills aimed at improving maternal and childbirth services in the country. This development underscores the importance of partnering with legislative bodies and policymakers in realizing our goals. Such partnerships are instrumental in shaping health policies and ensuring that necessary resources are allocated for these initiatives. "I earnestly sought approval of my bill considering that the maternal mortality and infant mortality are still on the rise. I also proposed the inclusion in the immunization program not only of tetanus, which I believe is the only one being given free, but also of other vaccines for acellular pertussis and diphtheria," he said.



Overcoming Challenges and Implementing Solutions:

To integrate these vaccines into the healthcare system, we are addressing challenges such as vaccine supply, accessibility, and public hesitancy. PIDSOG is actively working on strategies to mitigate these issues, focusing on policy advocacy, resource mobilization, and community outreach programs.

The Way Forward Progress and Next Steps:

Our meeting with the Committee on Health is just the beginning. The positive response from the committee members fuels our optimism for the future of this initiative. PIDSOG is committed to continuing its advocacy, working closely with policymakers and healthcare professionals to see this vision become a reality.

The inclusion of Influenza and Tdap vaccinations in maternal healthcare is a significant step towards safeguarding the health of mothers and their infants. With the support of key allies like the HRep Committee on Health, and through the collective efforts of various stakeholders, PIDSOG is committed to advancing this cause. Together, we are paving the way for a healthier future for Filipino families.


PSCM simultaneous session at the POGS Convention 2023




