

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE APPLICANT FOR PART 1 & PART 2 EXAMINATION

The applicant shall be responsible for obtaining all pertinent information and relevant data regarding the application process, including required documents, submission deadlines, examination approval status, and the date and venue of the examination. The applicant accepts full responsibility for submitting correct and complete requirements

An application may be disapproved by the PBOG en banc for the following reasons:

1. Lack of variety in indications and/or pathologies of the cases
2. Wrong sequence/arrangement of the compilation
3. Inconsistent dates in the tabulation
4. Incomplete and incorrect operative technique
5. Inconsistent or incomplete histopathology report
6. Incomplete supporting documents (partograms, CTG tracings)
7. Inappropriate and incomplete justification of cases
8. Incorrect management/procedure

Falsification of documents is sufficient ground for outright rejection/disapproval of an application. If falsification is proven, the candidate is disqualified for three (3) years and may only re-apply with PBOG en banc approval.

During the entire duration of the examination, any form of cheating, dishonesty, and unruly behavior shall constitute a breach of the rules. This shall result in the invalidation of the examination as well as the disqualification of the examinee from taking the examination for three (3) consecutive years without prejudice to additional sanctions that may be imposed by the PBOG.
